Future Ready Librarians New Jersey Resources to be Launched at NJASL Annual Conference

Future Ready Schools - New Jersey is collaborating with the New Jersey Association of School Librarians (NJASL) to provide guidance, support, and potential resources to New Jersey's Future Ready Librarians.

This FRS-NJ Resource Initiative is aligned to the national #FutureReadyLibs Framework and is designed to connect New Jersey's School Library Media Specialists to the resources of the vibrant national community and the collaborative support of the new #FutureReadyLibsNJ community. A task force was convened in September of 2018 to develop resource indicators and aligned guidance and resources for New Jersey's school library media specialists, which will be launched at the NJASL conference.

We invite anyone attending the conference to join the #FutureReadyLibsNJ team at 12:30 on Tuesday, December 4th at the annual NJASL conference for a luncheon panel celebrating the launch of this new initiative and to learn more about it directly from the chair, co-chairs, and the Future Ready Schools - New Jersey Team. Following the lunch panel will be a guided session that will enable you to dig into the indicators themselves and launch your #FutureReadyLibsNJ journey.

The #FutureReadyLibsNJ Indicators of Future Readiness are based on the model developed for the Future Ready Schools - New Jersey certification program and are designed to show what success looks like for the role of School Library Media Specialists. These indicators are designed to help you self-assess where you and your library stand on the path to being Future Ready so that you can plan your professional development and support your school and district's Future Ready efforts.

Along with the indicators, FRS-NJ has developed an Indicator tracking sheet based of on the model developed for the FRS-NJ certification program and is designed to enable you to record your self-assessment and plan your professional development based on the #FutureReadyLibsNJ Indicators of Future Readiness.

EducationSuperHighway: Free, Non-Profit Infrastructure Support

Preparing your school's network infrastructure for the integration of digital learning is a key step in making sure your classrooms support student-centered learning. The FRS-NJ initiative includes 17 technology indicators that maximize digital learning including three that solely focus on robust infrastructure. EducationSuper-Highway, a national non-profit dedicated to upgrading the internet access in America's classrooms, breaks down the steps your school can take to meet these indicators. Step one: Upgrade to fiber

Indicator: Intranet/Internet Network Availabil-

Fiber optic technology is the only internet connection capable of providing enough bandwidth for students and teachers to access digital learning. Many New Jersey schools still use cable internet, which is unfortunately prone to bottlenecks and slowdowns when users in the same area access the internet. Cable also typically maxes out at 150 Megabits per second (Mbps), which is not enough bandwidth for most New Jersey schools to meet the Federal Communications Commission's recommended 2018 goal of 1 Mbps/student. That's why schools across the state – from the urban centers to rural elementary schools - have upgraded to dedicated fiber to support their student's learning opportunities.

Step two: Maximize your purchasing power **Indicator:** Internet Connection

Thanks to publically available E-rate data, you can visit EducationSuperHighway's free school broadband comparison tool, <u>Compare & Connect K-12</u>, to understand

We can help you get the robust infrastructure the speed and pricing data for schools across New Jersey. Fiber is an important investment in your classrooms' future. This data has helped schools find the most affordable broadband deals in their area. We encourage you to find your school district and understand how much neighboring or similar school districts pay for high-speed fiber connections compared to your current contract. You can also use this data to start a conversation with your broadband service provider to negotiate a more affordable network upgrade.

Step three: Leverage the \$43M in federal funding for Wi-Fi

Indicator: Access Point Signal Saturation As educators implement 1:1 device environments,

online testing, and blended learning programs, your classrooms need strong Wi-Fi networks to avoid access point signal saturation. The federal E-rate program has earmarked over \$43M in funding for all New Jersey schools to cover the cost of equipment and services to support technology in the classroom. We encourage you to develop a plan and take action to take advantage of this funding now – it is set to expire this year.

Nearly 450 districts have leveraged this funding to make sure that bottlenecks don't become a barrier to classroom innovation, but 110 still have their full budget available. Find out how much funding your district has available on Compare & Connect K-12.

As a partner of the New Jersey Department of Education, our non-profit organization is dedicated to ensuring New Jersey schools have support in searching for options that meet Future Ready technical specifications. We encourage you to develop a plan and take action to take advantage of this funding now - as **\$14M** is set to expire this year.
