


Program Updates

2018 Task Force Efforts in Progress

In the first few weeks of January, the 2018 <u>FRS-NJ Task Forces</u> began the month-long process of updating the Indicators of Future Readiness, the core of the certification program, to meet the needs of the 2018 Certification Cycle.

The mission of this year's task forces is to standardize the format of the indicators and their rubrics, consolidate and organize them, identify priority indicators, incorporate additional resources to aid schools and districts' certification efforts as well as exemplars from 2017 certified schools, and finally to identify and develop any essential missing indicators. This year, 250 educators, leaders, and stakeholders volunteered to join the three task forces on Leadership, Education and Classroom Practice, and Technology Support and Services.

The new 2018 Indicators will be released on February 22nd in conjunction with the <u>North Regional Certification Summit</u> at NJIT and the kickoff of the 2018 Certification Cycle.

Future Ready Schools - New Jersey would not exist without the volunteerism and dedication of our task forces, their chairs, and their co-chairs. Thank you to the hundreds of educators who have worked on our task forces over the last two years!

The 2018 Regional Certification Summits

OnCourse Systems Sponsors 2018 Certification Summits:

OnCourse Systems for Education is sponsoring all three of this year's Regional Certification Summits! The team at OnCourse has been involved in and supporting the #FutureReadyNJ community from nearly the beginning. They took part in the Resource Fair and Resource Sessions at the inaugural Certification Summit at NJIT. OnCourse also sponsored one of our #FutureReadyResource events at NJIT, called the K-12 Data Visualization Summit.

The OnCourse team will be featured at all three of the 2018 Regional Certification Summits and will be available for attendees to discuss their future ready services and mission.

Certified Districts to Present at 2018 Certification Summits:

Each of the three 2018 Regional Certification Summits will feature a presentation by a district represented in the inaugural cohort of 2017 FRS-NJ Certified Schools. Each presentation is designed to provide attendees of each summit a narrative of each districts' "Future Ready Why," how and why the decided to join the #FutureReadyNJ community and seek certification in the program's inaugural year. In addition, each district will highlight one of their Future Ready initiatives or practices so that the whole community can be informed and inspired by them.

<u>Morris Plains</u> will be featured at the North summit on February 22nd, <u>Middletown Township</u> will be featured at the Central summit which they are hosting on February 26th, and <u>Washington Township</u> will be featured at the South summit on February 27th.

LumApps and the Upcoming FRS-NJ Collaboration Platform:

One of FRS-NJ four missions is to foster inclusive collaboration both within schools and districts, as well as between schools and districts from across the state. To better facilitate the networking and communication needed to successfully collaborate with other members of the FRS-NJ community, we have been collaborating ourselves with LumApps, a Google Suite intranet provider, to officially establish a collaboration platform for our website, www.frsnj.org.

Currently in development, this collaboration platform will enable school and district teams to work towards certification submissions and allow the entire FRS-NJ community to ask questions, network, seek collaborative opportunities, and otherwise interact with other community members in a dedicated space focused on the Future Ready mindset.

The LumApps team will be at all three of our 2018 Regional Certification Summits, where some of the intended features will be announced and feedback and requests will be taken into consideration as we plan, build, and eventually launch the platform.
